#### **Attendance**

As a reminder, classroom instruction begins at 9:15am each school day. Students can enter through the Front Doors or through Door 10 near the back car loop off of W. 51st St. beginning at 8:45am. Please do not drop your child off before 8:45am as there will be no adult supervision until that time. Students will be directed to lines outside their classrooms (Gr. 1-4) or the gym (Kindergarten). Any student arriving after 9:15am will need to enter through the Front Doors and will be directed to the Main Office to get a tardy pass to class.

#### **COVID Protocols 2021-22**

Families should access this document to review the current PCSD COVID Protocols for the 2021-22 school year. Parents and guardians should check their students for symptoms before they leave for school each day and keep their child(ren) home from school if they are sick or exhibit any of the symptoms listed in the document. As a reminder, masks or face coverings are strongly recommended for all staff, students, and visitors of every PCSD building.

#### **Nutrition Services**

Every student can receive a free breakfast and lunch for the 2021-22 school year through a grant from the federal government. Breakfast is available everyday from 8:45-9:15am. Students arriving tardy to school can receive a bagged breakfast until 9:30 each morning. The September breakfast menu can be found here. Students receive 60 minutes for lunch and recess every day. Students can choose from 3 lunch options daily: hot lunch entree, cold lunch, or homemade peanut butter and jelly sandwich. Kindergarteners eat from 11:40-12:10pm; 1st graders eat from 12:05-12:35pm; 2nd graders eat from 12:15-12:45pm; 3rd graders eat from 12:45-1:15pm; and 4th graders eat from 1:15-1:45pm. Parents of students wishing to purchase snacks, ice cream, or milk (for packers) will need to add funds to their student's MySchoolBucks account. That website can be accessed here. Applications need to be completed only for students that are new to the district for P-EBT purposes.

#### **Annual Emergency Contact Form**

This school year, the Parma City School District has transitioned to an all online way of updating student emergency contact information. In years past, parents have been asked to complete the Blue Card each year and return it to school. This year, the district is using an online Refresh form. The form can be accessed here. Parents should have received a Snapcode in the mail in late summer. #### **PBIS Updates**

Many parents ask What is PBIS? The following information from the Ohio Dept. of Education's website: Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS), is a broad range of systemic and individualized strategies for achieving important social learning outcomes in communities while preventing problem behavior. The key attributes of PBS include preventive activities, data-based decision making, and a problem solving orientation (Horner, 2000; Lewis & Sugai, 1999; Sugai et.al., 2000; Weigle, 1997).

The PBIS Teams at Thoreau Park have worked hard over the past 5 years to implement effective strategies for all of our students. The state recently awarded our school the Silver Award for our effective PBIS Tier 1 and Tier 2 programs. This year, our team will work to earn the Gold award for our Tier 3 programs. More information on each of the PBIS 3 tiers of intervention will be explained in future issues of the Panther Post.
