

Played college football at The Ohio State University in 1946 & 1947.

Transferred to Baldwin Wallace College in 1948. Jim played basketball (1949) and football 1949 & 1950. Was elected captain of the football team in 1950. Began his coaching career at Parma Sr. High coaching golf for ten years. In 1962 he became the Head Football Coach at Valley Forge High School where her commanded the sidelines for eleven seasons winning the Lake Erie League in 1963 and 1968. Jim also served as the Golf Coach winning three LEL titles.



BOB LADE WRESTLING 1965-1968

Bob Lade was a letter winner in wrestling during each of his three years at Valley Forge. He wrestled on three LEL Championship teams as well as Brecksville and Sectional Meet Championship teams. The 1968 Patriot Wrestling Team took several Wrestlers to the Ohio State Championship Meet and Bob won the First Place Medal. Based on the depth and talent of the Valley Forge wrestlers, the Patriots earned a trophy for Second Place. After graduation, Bob served in the military in the late 1960's and is now retired.

JIM WOLF BASKETBALL & TRACK 1964-1967

Varsity VF record 45-11 & varsity Penn record 68-13. Undefeated regular senior seasons at VF 18-0 & Penn 25-0. Cleveland Press & Cleveland Plain Dealer first team All Star 1965-66 & 1966-67, Cleveland Call & Post All Star Captain 1966-67. 40 year career record at VF with 1,047 points and high game record of 42 points. Tied VF high jump record of 6'2". Recruited by 120 colleges. Played basketball and ran track (2 years) at the University of Pennsylvania in the Ivy League. Philadelphia Big 5 Player of the Week & Ivy

League Player of the Week. AP ranked 7th 1969-70 & 3rd 1970-71, undefeated in the Big 5 and Ivy League both years. Longest regular season winning streak in the nation at 43. Drafted by the NBA's Los Angelis Lakers & ABA's Carolina Cougars. Resides in Sharon, PA with spouse Susan. Has two daughters, three grand children, and retired Business Manager Sharon City School District.



GENE ZAYAC CROSS COUNTRY & BASEBALL 1961-1964

Gene Zayac was almost a lifelong Valley Forge Patriot. He was a student at Valley Forge from opening day and returned from college to teach at VF until his retirement in 2003. While a student at VF, Gene was a Letterman in Cross Country and Baseball during all three years. Gene was a key member of the 1963 Cross Country Team which was the first team in the short history of Valley Forge to win an LEL Championship.

During the spring of 1964, Gene was selected to the All Greater Cleveland Team and participated in the East-West All Star Game. He attended The Ohio State University and was a member of the Buckeye NCAA Championship Baseball Team (his picture is still on display on campus).
























JIM FRITZSCHE JR FOOTBALL 1975-1978



He was a four year letterman and three year starter while at Syracuse. He received the Joseph Alexander Award for excellence in academics, was named to the East Coast Conference first team, and was selected as an Eastern Academic All– American. Andy went on to the NFL playing for the "Air Coryell" San Diego Chargers from 1981-1985. He currently resides in Southern California with his family.



JIM KOVACH FOOTBALL, BASKETBALL, BASEBALL 1971-1974

Dr. Jim Kovach received his medical degree while simultaneously playing in the National Football League. He attended law school at Stanford University and practiced corporate law, worked at CWRU school of Medicine, was COO of Athersys, Inc., a public biotech company, President of the Buck Institute for Age Research, and has served on the NFL Head, Neck and Spine Committee. He lives in California where he launches technology companies to deliver new product to the sports and medical marketplace.



ANDY MOLLS FOOTBALL, BASKETBALL, TRACK 1976-1979

Whatever accolades I received throughout my life I owe to my parents and family. They were the ones who helped me develop my core values, set realistic goals and inspired me to push myself beyond limits. I guess one of the benefits of being the youngest child was attending and watching thousands of sporting events that my three brothers and sister participated in. Unfortunately the downside was trying to follow in their footsteps since they undoubtedly set the bar of success extremely high. I knew my challenge to duplicate or surpass them would take a tremendous effort. I started my athletic career competing in CYO sports (Football, Basketball, Track) from the 5th grade through 8th grade for Holy Family Church under local legendary football coaches Al Marconi, Al Heinrich and basketball coach Walt Olszewski. While attending Pleasant Valley Junior High I split time between CYO and public school competition until 9th grade, participating on as many athletic teams as possible. Attended Valley Forge High School in the fall of 1976 and officially made the Varsity Football team my sophomore year just turning 15 years old. I started out as a backup quarterback and was eventually switched to free safety and started all 10 games. In the winter of 1976 I officially made the Varsity Basketball team as a sophomore and in the spring acquired my first letter in Track. As a junior in the fall of 1977 I was a two way starter at fullback and free safety playing both ways the entire football season earning a Plain Dealer All Scholastic nomination. In the winter I was officially a starting point guard for the basketball team and eventually earned my second letter in track. Going into my senior year and final football season of 1978, I was finally moved to tailback and continued my tenure at free safety playing both ways. I ended my season with 999 yards rushing, 6 offensive rushing records, 2 Kickoff returns, Press All Scholastic, Plain Dealer All Scholastic, All LEL, MVP of the LEL and was voted to the North vs South All Star Game. Finished my basketball career as a starter under legendary coach John Stavole and earned my third letter in Track. Highly recruited, I finally accepted a full athletic scholarship from the University of Kentucky and reported to camp in July 1979 at 17 years old. Played at free safety and finally broke into the starting lineup after the third game of my freshman season which I sustained for all four years. Was name All SEC 1981, Nominated as an Press UPI All American 1981, Lead the nation in Punt Return Yardage 1981, Voted Team Captain 1982, Selected to compete in three national All Star Football Games, Hula Bowl, Japan Bowl and Blue/White Bowl 1982. Selected as a Free-Agent by the Houston Oilers in 1983 was released, Selected as a Free-Agent by the Arizona Wranglers of the USFL in 1984 was released. Graduated in 1983 with a Degree in Communications, Married my wife Linda in 1988 and have four beautiful children Audrey, Danny, Carly, Kelsey. Coached 9 years of CYO football for St Columbkille and St Albert the Great. Coached 5 years for Padua Franciscan High School Currently the Telecommunications Manager for Kent State University



MICHELLE MOLLS VOLLEYBALL, GYMNASTICS, SOFTBALL 1973-1976

MICHELLE MOLLS WAS AMONG THE VANGUARD OF YOUNG LADIES WHO WERE ABLE TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF TITLE IX WHICH OPENED DOORS TO WOMEN'S VARSITY SPORTS AT VALLEY FORGE HIGH SCHOOL. DURING THE FIRST 12 YEARS, VALLEY FORGE ONLY HAD INTRAMURAL ATHLETIC PROGRAMS FOR FEMALE STUDENTS. MICHELL LETTERED IN GYMNASTICS, SOFTBALL, AND VOLLEYBALL DURING HER THREE YEARS AT VALLEY FORGE. SHE WAS SELECTED AS THE FIRST OUTSTANDING FEMALE ATHLETE IN 1976. DURING HER SENIOR YEAR IN GYMNASTICS, MICHELLE WAS RECOGNIZED AS A HIGH SCHOOL ALL AMERICAN.



STEVE RUDO HEAD WRESLING COACH 1961-1978

Steve Rudo achieved championships at every level in his athletic career, both as a wrestler and as a coach. In high school at West Tech he placed 3rd in the state meet in 1952 and was a member of the 1953 state championship team. In college at Ohio University, Steve was a three-time Mid-American Conference (MAC) Champion, gained All-American honors and had a 24-2-1 record in dual-match competition. He was on the Bobcats' 1955 and 1956 MAC championship teams.

Prior to Valley Forge's opening, Steve started his teaching career at Schaaf Junior High School in 1957 and volunteered as an assistant wrestling coach at Parma Senior High School. When Valley Forge High School opened in 1961, he joined the faculty as an industrial arts teacher. He began the wrestling program, which soon became one of the better high school wrestling programs in Greater Cleveland. He coached for 20 years, posting a dual-match record of 146 wins, 33 losses, 3 ties and one state championship (1972). That state championship is the only one in any sport in the history of the Parma Schools. Steve's teams were state runners-up in 1967 and in 1968.

In addition to those successes, he coached 30 state qualifiers, 3 individual state champs, won 10 Lake Erie League titles, 7 Brecksville Holiday Tournament Titles and 1 District title.

Steve also was the head baseball coach at Valley Forge for ten years, until it was decided that you were only allowed to coach one sport. He chose to continue coaching wrestling.

Steve was inducted into the Ohio University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1979 and into the Greater Cleveland Sports Hall of Fame in 1992.

After retiring from VF in 1985, he taught architectural drafting at Tri-C West for 10 years. .



PAT SEMARY WRESTLING COACH 1966-2001

In 1966 became an assistant coach at Valley Forge under the legendary coach, Steve Rudo. He remained assistant until 1977. During that time he was privileged to be part of 10 LEL Championships, 7 Brecksville Tournament Championships, 2 State Runner—Up finishes, and a State Championship in 1972. During that time Valley Forge had 36 State Qualifiers, 16 State Placers, and 3 State Champions.


In 1978, Pat became Head Coach and held that position until 2001. As Head Coach for the Patriots, his teams had a dual meet record of 196-128, won 5 LEL Championships and were runner up several times. Won the Solon Invitational in 1972 and placed in the top 4 at the Brecksville Tournament 6 times, including Runner–Up finishes in 1984 and 1992. His teams won 2 Sectional Championships. During his tenure, VF had over 80 District Qualifiers, 15 State Qualifiers, 7 State Placers, and 2 State Champions. Pat spent 29 years in the Parma School system as an Art Teacher and Wrestling Coach.

He has been honored by the Greater Cleveland Wrestling Coaches and Officials Association Division I Coach of the Year 3 times, once in 1992, and in 2007 and again in 2013. Pat was installed in the Kent State Athletic Hall of Fame in 1994.



MIKE TRETIAKOW TRACK 1972-1975

I was always racing the other kids in the neighborhood when I was young. I started competing in track and field at age 10 in the Parma Junior Olympics. By the time I was in high school I had experience in the short sprints, hurdles and the long jump, later adding the high jump. In high school, I was fortunate to have Coach Vicek mentoring me in the high hurdles. I had success in this event, winning the Knights of Columbus indoor 50 yard high hurdles with a meet record time. As a junior in high school, I was the Lake Erie league champ in the high hurdles and high jump. Our hurdle relay posted the fastest time in Ohio. I was injured as a senior but came back in time to capture the Ohio state runner-up spot with a 6'7" high jump. I continued running track at Cleveland State University. I set school records in the 110 meter high hurdles and the long jump, winning the long jump at the Pitt Invitational and the Ohio State Invitational. I earned the "Most Valuable Athlete" at the Cleveland Colleges Track and Field Championship meet, winning the high hurdles, high jump, long jump and 400 meter relay. After college, I coached at the high school and junior high levels in Parma and Berea. I was a mentor to Sherry Pastor in the hurdles who became the first female track athlete at Valley Forge to become a state champion. I currently work at University Hospitals Parma Medical Center as an cardiopulmonary exercise specialist. I continue to be active coaching my heart patients towards healthier lifestyles. Personally, I enjoy all physical activities that my body will still allow me to participate in, including commuting to work on my bicycle, mountain biking, snorkeling and hiking. Finally, I would like to thank all the great teachers of the Parma City School district who I was lucky enough to be coached by, including but not limited to Bob Vicek, David Durrell, Nancy Fedak, Terry Wandt, and Bob Ramlow. These individuals positively influenced my life and I am very grateful for this.



Coleen Gallagher participated in cross country, basketball, and track earning 9 letters from 1980 -1983. She is among the top point leaders on the all-time scoring list, and was a key member of the Patriot teams which qualified to the regional tournament. During her Cross Country career, Coleen led the Patriots to an LEL championship and finished 3rd individually in the Ohio State Meet where she established the 5 K Patriot record time of18: 04. She is, also, the Patriot record holder in several individual and relay events. Coleen qualified for the State Track Meet in several events, earning 3rd in the 1600 M run and 5th in the 4 x 800 M relay. Coleen earned a scholarship to Villanova participating in Cross Country and Track. She is a two time All-American. Her teams won nine Big East Conference Championships and eleven teams qualified for the NCAA Championships. She earned six Big East Conference titles (including relays). The Wildcat 4x800 Relay team briefly held an indoor meet World Record. Coleen earned a law degree from Catholic University in Washington DC and now lives with her family in Potomac Maryland.



MARK HENEGHAN FOOTBALL 1982-1986

Mark was a 3 year Varsity starter ('83-'85) for the Patriots. Earning Second Team All Ohio '85, Sun West Co-defensive MVP '85, Plain Dealer Northeast Ohio All-Star '85, and Two time All LEL First Team.

After High School, I remained in the area and live in Parma with my wife Tracy and two daughters Paige and Kaitlin. I have been working as a Pipefitter for Local 120 for 20 years. AUDREY WARNOCK BASKETBALL, SOFTBALL 1981-1985



1987-1988 BOYS BASKEBALL TEAM FINAL FOUR 21-4




JOHN STAVOLE HEAD BASKETBALL COACH 1979—2000




RICH YURKIEWICZ FOOTBALL, BASEBALL, HOCKEY 1987-1991
