Selection Criteria: Students attending PCSD high schools that have turned in application by the deadline will be registered first. Students attending member charter schools and or online schools that have turned in application by the deadline will be registered second. Students that turn applications in after the deadline, regardless of the school attending, will be placed on a wait list if the program is already full. If a program is oversubscribed, students will be selected based on attendance and disciplinary.
