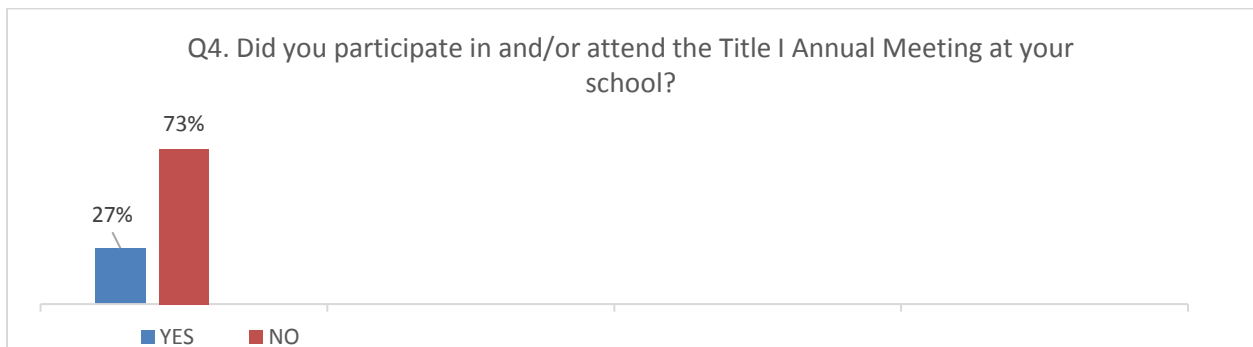
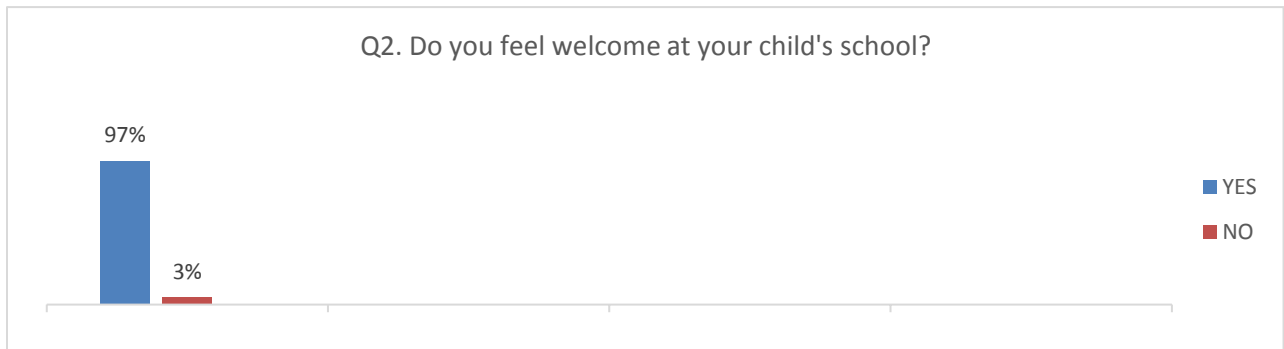
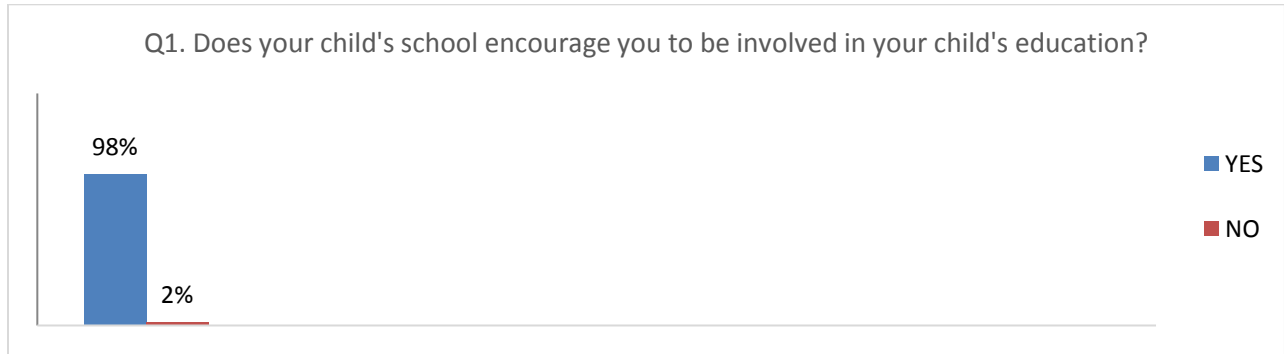
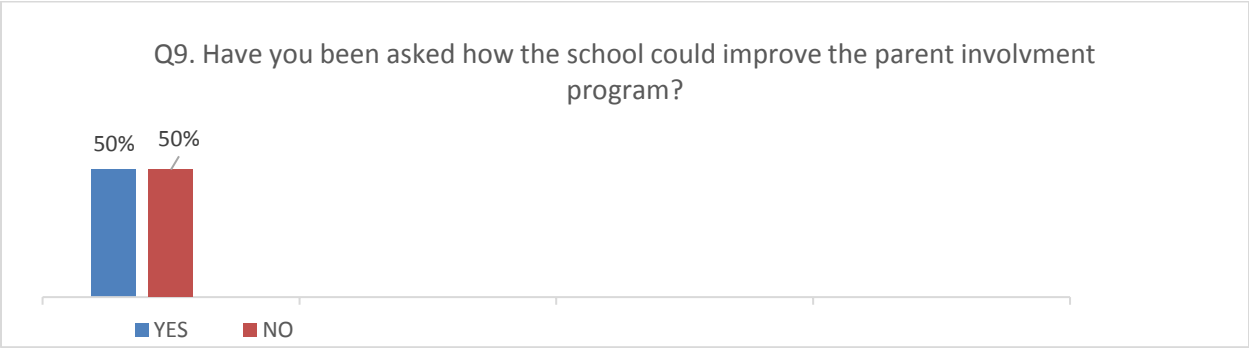
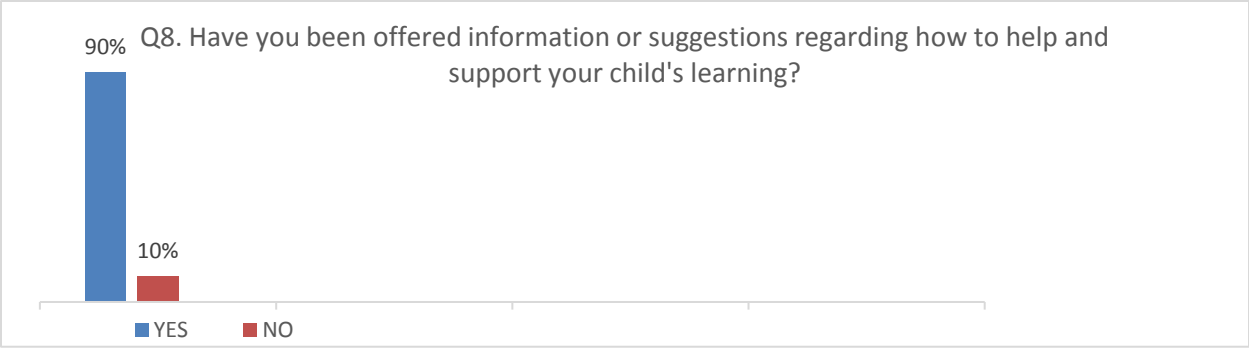
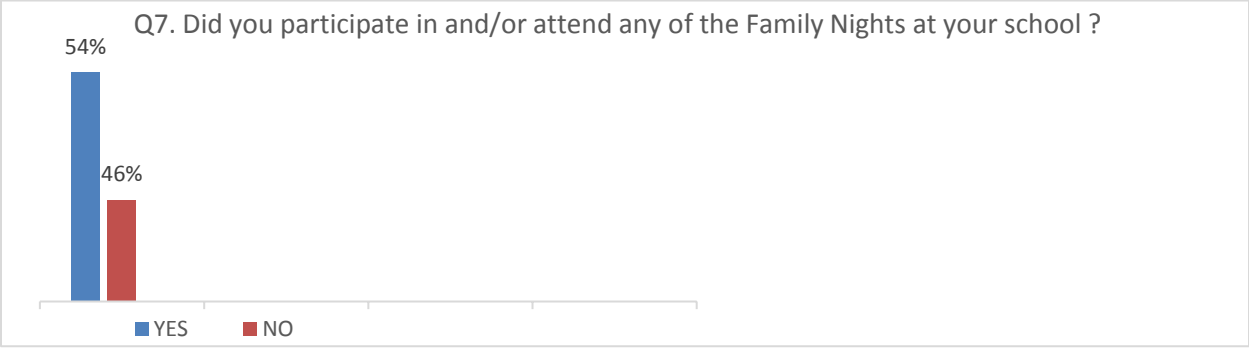
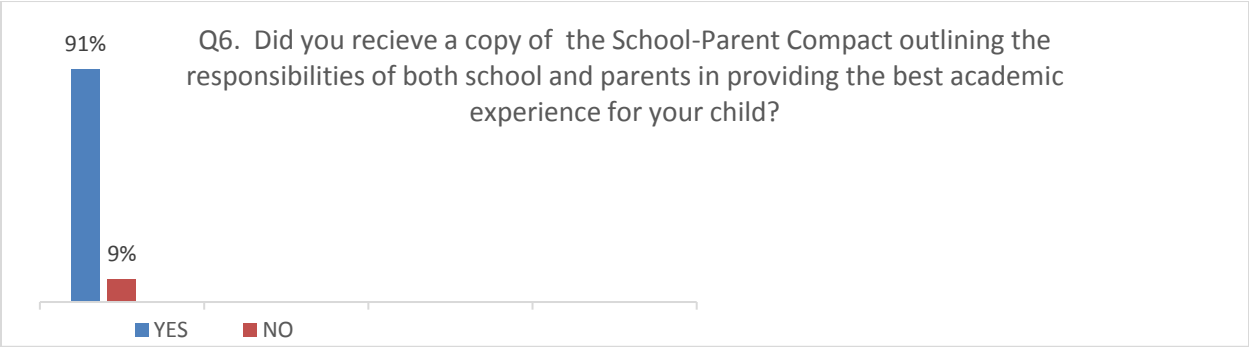
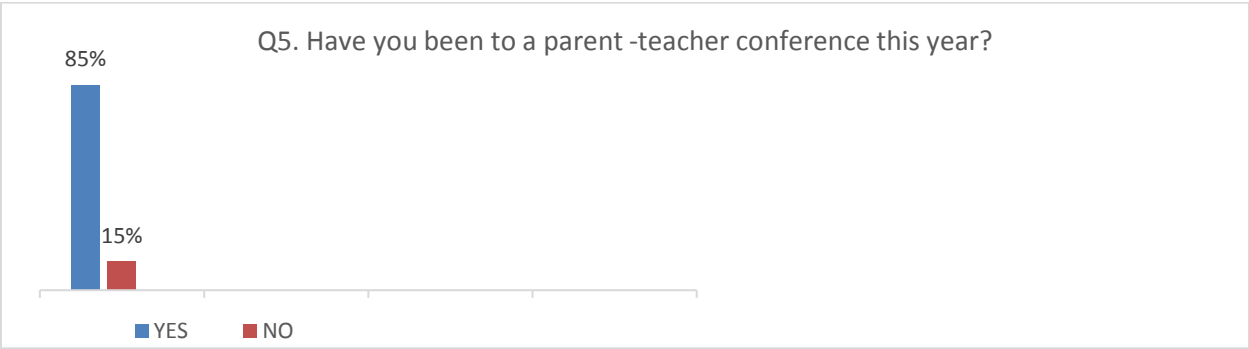
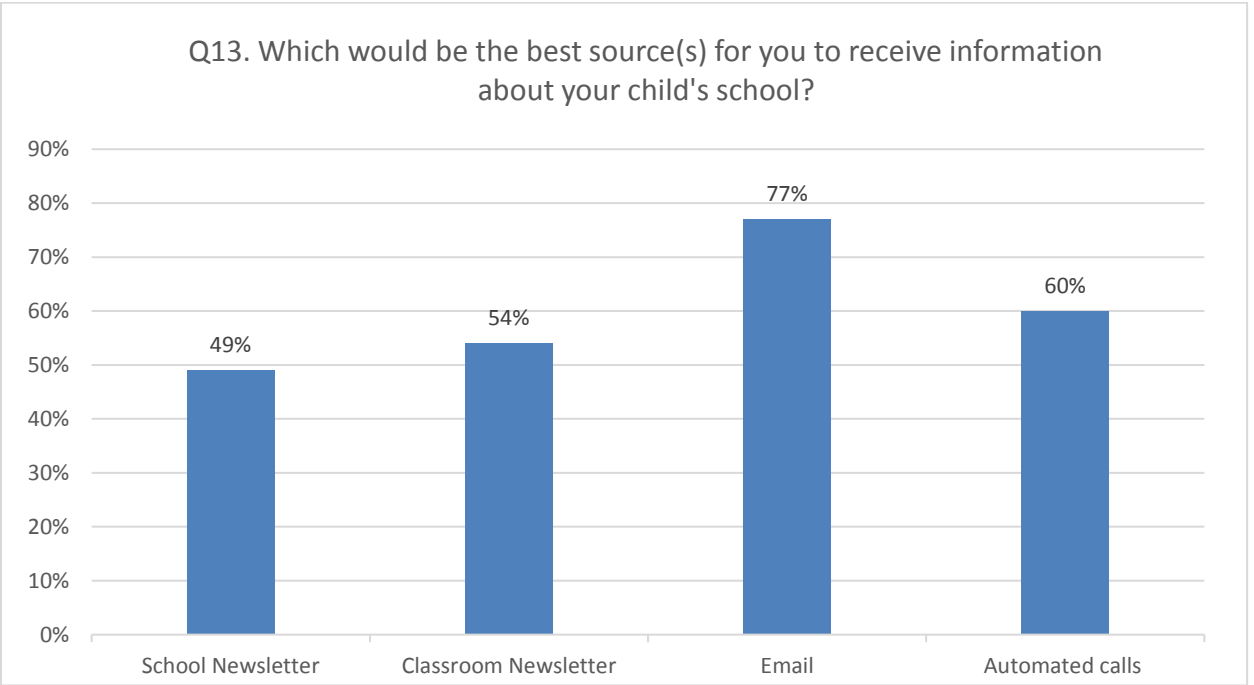
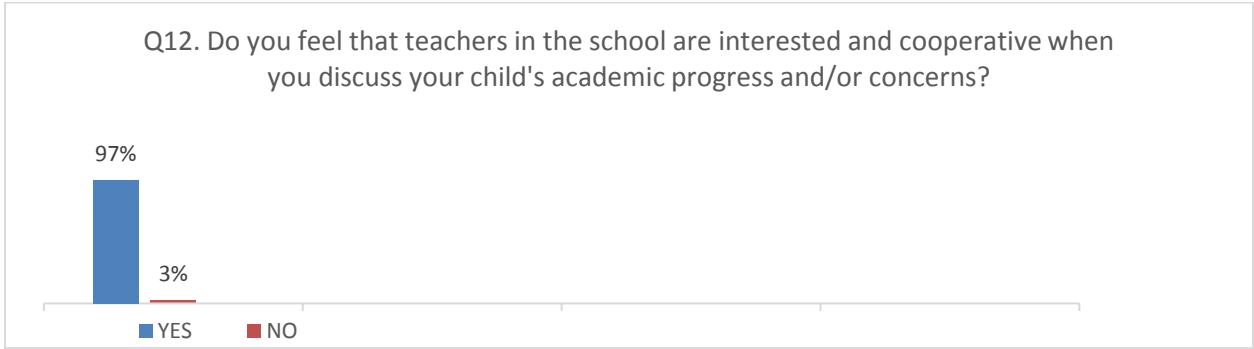
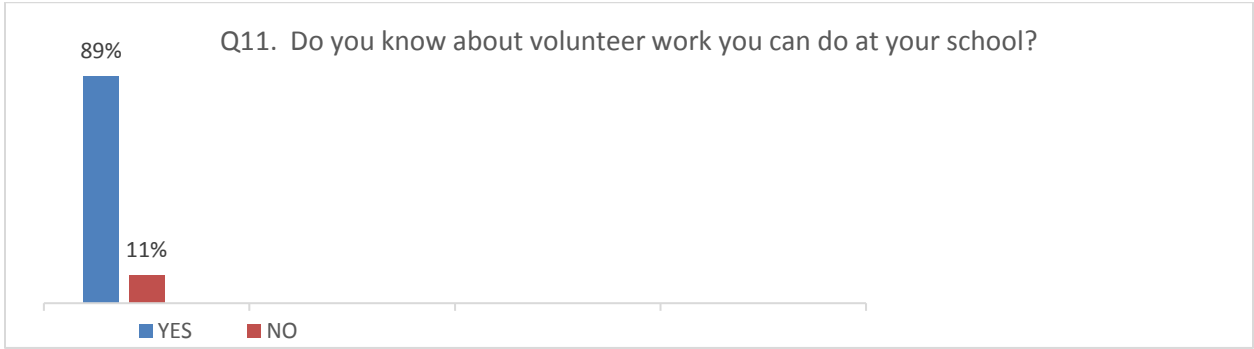
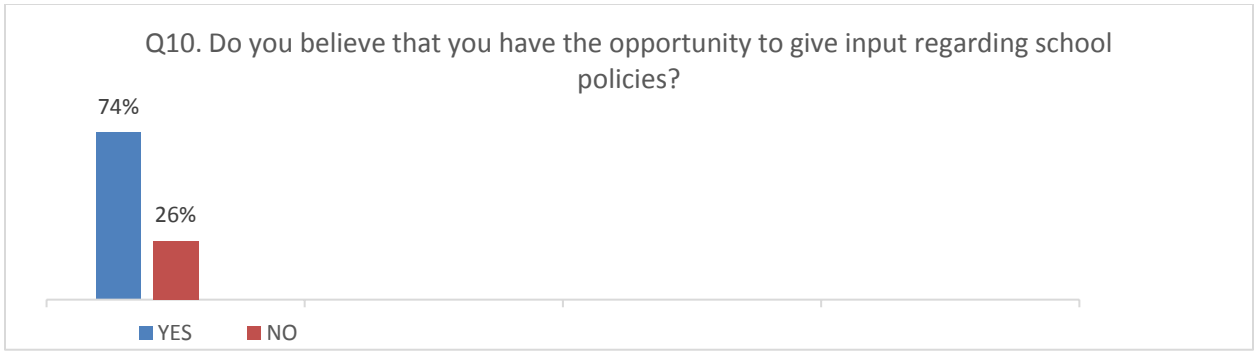


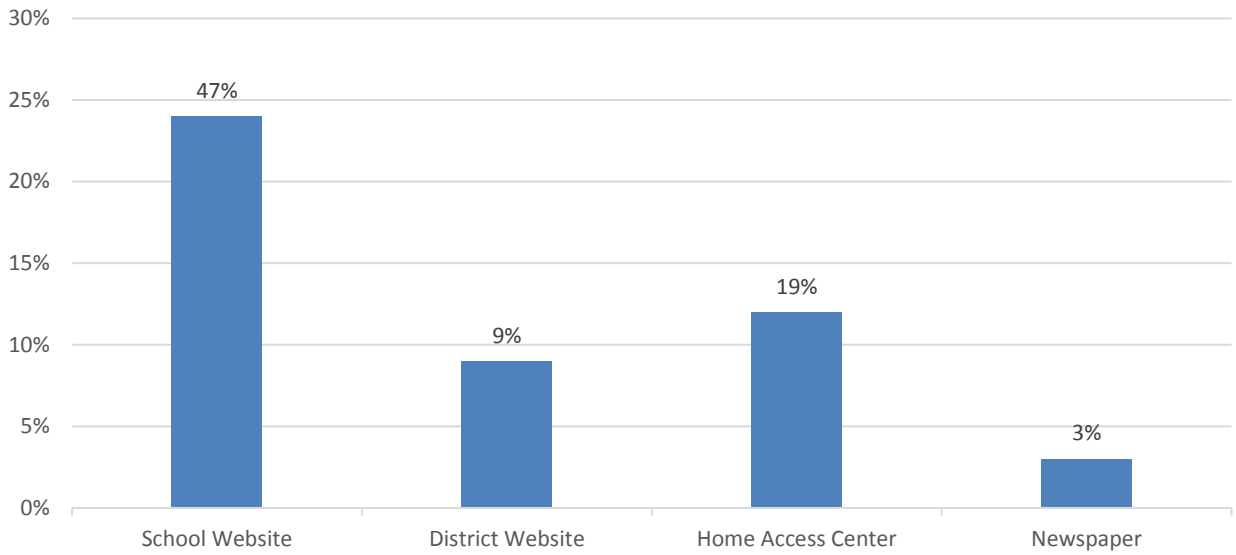
## Spring 2018 Title I Parent Survey Results
