District Elementary Goal (ELA): By the end of the 2022-23 school year, 100% or more of second, third and fourth grade students will be considered *on track* and *low risk* of not passing ELA OST as measured by MAP benchmark reading scores.

District Elementary Goal (Math): By the end of the 2022-23 school year, 100% or more of second, third and fourth grade students will be considered *on track* and *low risk* of not passing Math OST as measured by MAP benchmark math scores.
