PARMA CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT GOALS

District Elementary Goal (TGRG): By the end of the 2020-2021 school year, 100% of third grade students will meet the requirements of the *Third Grade Reading Guarantee* as measured by MAP *and/or* AIR assessments.

District Elementary Goal (ELA): By the end of the 2020-2021 school year, 85% or more of second, third and fourth grade students will be considered *on track* and *low risk* of not passing ELA AIR as measured by MAP benchmark reading scores.

District Elementary Goal (Math): By the end of the 2020-2021 school year, 85% or more of second, third and fourth grade students will be considered *on track* and *low risk* of not passing Math AIR as measured by MAP benchmark math scores.
