### Emergency Updates - Important Information to Complete by October 6, 2022.

I want to thank the many families who completed their Emergency Update last week from the many reminders that we sent. Our district has extended the deadline for submission to Thursday, October 6 before Chromebook access is turned off. ### **Student Behaviors - 8th Grade Students**

I want to mention a few challenges that we have been seeing regarding many of our 8th grade students. Specifically, the amount of disruption that is being caused by horseplay and non-compliant behavior that is simply not acceptable for school. Mr. Knapp, our deputy principal, met with all 8th grade classes this morning to remind them of our expectations for following reasonable requests and that we expect mature behavior without the amount and type of horseplay that we have seen from too many students.

We have been very understanding of our 8th grade students' transition to a new school, and have provided multiple warnings and support to improve behaviors. However, now that we have turned over into October, students who have been given multiple warnings and/or referrals should expect to see consequences progress. We want our students to understand that disruptive behavior affects others students and the building in general. Behavior and the consequences that occur often take students away from the learning that occurs in classrooms. Thank you for your support in this matter.

### **BUILDING OUR FUTURE:**

Our district will have a bond issue on the ballot in November to build a new high school on the site of Parma Senior High. This [video](#) shows the rendering of the new high school. ### **AP Information/Registration Process and Dates**

Here are the important dates for the registration process:

- Sat, Oct 1, 2022, at 12:01 AM - Registration Begins
- Wed, Nov 9, 2022, at 11:59 PM - Registration and exam payment Ends
- Wed, March 15, 2023 - Last and final day exams may be canceled again any exam canceled after Nov15, 2022, to this date will acquire the \$40.00 cancellation fee.

This year each AP exam costs \$99.00. Parma Senior High School desires that every student be able to take their AP exams. Any exam registration after Nov 15, 2022, will have a \$40.00 late fee applied on top of the normal \$99.00 exam fee, and any exam canceled after Nov 15, 2022, will acquire a \$40.00 cancellation fee.

## Student Attendance/Tardies

In each update I have included information indicating that students who attend school and their classes regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance and/or large amounts of missed time due to tardiness. ## LOCKER REQUESTS:

Lockers will be assigned by request only. Students that wish to have a locker can make their request in the student service office where they can see Mrs. Haslem or Ms. Flors. Students will then fill out a locker request form and MUST submit their lock combination or a spare key in order to obtain their locker. All lockers are school property and subject to search at any time. This can be done anytime now from 9:00am-2:00pm. Students may also wait until the first week of school to stop by student services to request a locker.

## PARKING PERMITS:

This year, we will not require a vehicle inspection, however, in order to obtain a parking permit students must bring payment, a completed parking pass application, driver's license, registration and proof of insurance to our treasurer, Mrs. Kish, anytime between 9:00am and 2:00pm beginning this week.. Please note, there may be no outstanding student fees in order to be issued a parking permit. Student Parking Permits are required at all buildings and will be monitored this year.
