LOCKER REQUESTS:

Lockers will be assigned by request only. Students that wish to have a locker can make their request in the student service office where they can see Mrs. Haslem or Ms. Flors. Students will then fill out a locker request form and **MUST** submit their lock combination or a spare key in order to obtain their locker. All lockers are school property and subject to search at any time. This can be done anytime now from 9:00am-2:00pm. Students may also wait until the first week of school to stop by student services to request a locker.

PARKING PERMITS:

This year, we will not require a vehicle inspection, however, in order to obtain a parking permit students must bring payment, a completed parking pass application, driver's

Please note, there may be no outstanding student fees in order to be issued a parking permit. Student Parking Permits are required at all buildings and will be monitored this year.
