What is the Title I Program ?

- Title I is a federally funded program that provides intervention to economically disadvantaged and academically eligible students.
- The program originally was called the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. (ESEA)



Title I Program

- The program initially proved successful until the 80's when closing the achievement gap basically stalled. Many of Johnson's social programs were dismantled except for Title I. The program was also called Chapter I.
- Johnson, himself was a teacher.



Types of Title I Programs

- Targeted Assistance – a school that is eligible for Title I services because it is over the district percentage averages for free/reduced lunch applications.
- PCSD has 7 Title I schoolwide buildings and serves 15 Title I Targeted-Assistance non-public schools.

Schoolwide Programs

- All children in the school are considered Title I students.
- School must provide the parents a compact.
- Hold an annual meeting that includes parents in evaluating or providing input into the program.
- Evaluate the school's plan effectiveness.
- Monthly newsletters
- Parent Involvement activities that invites the whole school.

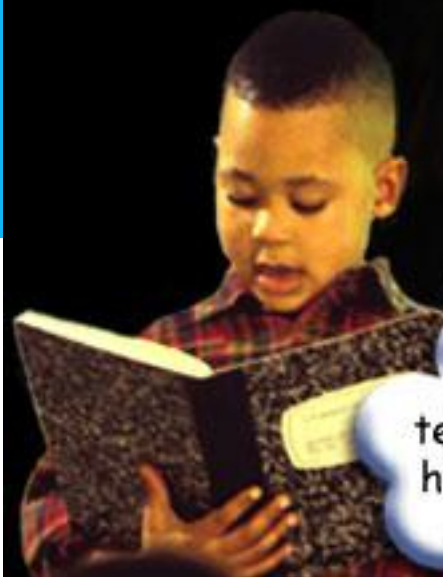

Parent Right to Know

- You have the right to know about the teacher qualifications of your child's classroom teacher in a school receiving Title I funds.
- The federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requires that any school district receiving Title I funds must notify parents of each student attending any school receiving Title I funds that they may request, and the district will provide the parents on request (and in timely manner), information regarding the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teachers, including the minimum, the following:



Parent Right to Know

These qualifications include:

1. Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
2. Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.

Parent Right to Know

- 3. Whether the teacher is teaching in the field discipline of the certification of the teacher; and
- 4. Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

Third Grade Guarantee

- SB 316, Ohio School districts must follow.
- All student in grades K-3 will be given a reading diagnostic assessment by September 30th. Parents of students that are considered “not on track” will be notified.
- Students will receive evidenced-based interventions.
