At John Muir, we believe it is our mission to to increase student achievement and social-emotional health through student-centered instruction, positive family-school partnerships, and providing a safe learning environment.

Parent "Right to Know!"

As a parent of a student at a Title I served school, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers and requires the information to be given to you in a timely manner. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- 1. Whether the teacher has met the State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;**
- 2. Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;**
- 3. Whether the teacher is teaching in the field of discipline of his/her certification; and**
- 4. Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.**

You can view this information at the Ohio Department of Education's website (<https://education.ohio.gov>). Click on the "Teacher" tab; then, under "Resources," click "Educator Profile." Now type in the teacher's first and last name, and click on "Search Educator" to view the teacher's area of certification.
