What is the Corrective Reading program?

At Ridge-Brook, Corrective Reading is used during PIE Time. This program is taught by the Title I Teachers.

Corrective Reading is a direct-instruction program designed to improve reading accuracy (decoding skills), fluency and comprehension skills.

What do the students learn and master in the Corrective Reading program?

Phonics and Word Analysis

- Sound-symbol relationships with an emphasis on consonant blends, vowel sounds and word endings
- Spelling
- Blending

Word Reading:

Students will master the decoding and reading of:

- Words with consistent orthographic relationships
- Silent E words
- Irregular Words
- High Frequency Words
- Daily Reading of decodable connected text

Fluency:

The students will become fluent readers by:

- Tracking as they read
- Reading and rereading text
- Practice for rate and accuracy
- Charting of daily fluency progress

Comprehension:

The students will learn how to:

- Identify and provide story details
- Identify the cause and effect
- Identify the main idea
- Retell the story
- Compare and contrast two topics
- Determine the meaning of vocabulary words by using context clues
