Gifted

Students sometimes feel an unspoken expectation to always achieve at high levels. We are working to build habits of being a scholar. Being a scholar is not about straight As or being mistake-free. It is how we approach learning. According to the research of Dr. Sandra Kaplan, scholars:

Take the time to think about what they are learning. Are prepared and ready to learn with the tools necessary for the job. Understand that no matter how much we learn, there is always more to learn. Organize their learning and find ways to save their ideas. Exercise their minds and learn to keep going, even when faced with hard work. Set goals in life and learning. Take pride in their work and seek excellence in their finished products.

There are some general strategies for promoting these habits in your child. First, provide positive reinforcement whenever they display one of the habits. In addition to recognizing these traits your child, point them out when within encountering characters in favorite books, movies, or television shows, discussing eminent people in society, or even when sharing stories of family members past and present. Finally, identify one or two habits to develop further in your child. Spend time doing activities that will give them a chance to exercise that specific habit and then talk through it or reflect on how your child used the habit afterwards. With enough deliberate practice, these will eventually become routine.

Encore - PE

During the first quarter of the school year Physical Education classes had a focus of moving safely through the Gym for K-2nd grade, and Football being the focus for students in 3rd and 4th grade. During the second quarter we will be focusing on Soccer skills, along with manipulative skills utilizing



beanbags, scarves, and hula hoops. Students have been doing a great job working with two classes in the gym at the same time and we hope they continue to be Respectful, Responsible, and Ready to Learn. Remember 7 days with no physical activity makes one weak! Stay active!




at 10 branches. Students who participate in the program receive homework assistance from trained tutors in the following subjects:

Second Step - SEL

As part of our PBIS Initiative at Dentzler, our teachers are infusing a Social Emotional Learning (SEL) curriculum into their daily routines. With a

lesson focused once a each week, this curriculum teaches our students important skills such as how to have empathy, emotion management, problem solving skills, friendship skills, and response



friendship skills, and responsibility.

The weekly focus for each lesson varies, and there will be at least one lesson taught each week. Each grade level is focusing on finishing their Unit 2 Lessons for the next 4-5 weeks. Please talk with your child about these lessons, it will help to reinforce them at home! If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your child's homeroom teacher.

4th Grade: Introducing Emotion Management, Managing Strong Feelings, Calming Down Anger, Managing Anxiety


Super Soaring Eagles
